Installation Instructions:

- 1. Ensure the power is OFF before installation.
- 2. Place the light on a stable surface and remove the U-bracket from the LED floodlight with an Allen key, store the retaining bolts, split-locks and washers (fig. 1).
- 3. Present the U-bracket to a suitable surface and position to make sure the light will be mounted flush. Check with a spirit level if required.
- 4. Mark out two suitable fixing positions. Use suitable tools and fixings to mount the U-bracket safely and securely to the surface. We recommend using washers to fix the U-bracket. Avoid any damages to the wiring (fig2.).
- 5. Make sure the U-bracket is well mounted to the light with the correct way up and appropriate angle. Ensure bolts are installed tightly on both sides of the U-bracket (fig. 3).
- 6. Connect the light cable to the waterproof junction box and pay attention to the polarity and ground wire. The flood light is a CLASS I device, so earthing connection is mandatory.



7. Check the connections and switch power ON when safe to do so.

Warnings:

- 1. Installation must be completed by a qualified electrician in accordance with all recognized local and national electrical and construction regulations.
- 2. Ensure that the power is OFF during installation and that power cannot be unexpectedly reconnected.
- 3. The light fitting is designed to operate with a 220 240VAC 50/60Hz electricity supply. Do not use the light fitting if the protection glass is missing or damaged. Do not open the driver cover or remove the protection glass.
- 4. This light fitting is rated IP65 suitable for indoor and outdoor usage, such as gardens, entrances, garages, parking areas, corridors etc. Do not immerse in water.
